

We are delighted to invite you to join us on this voyage along Europe's Atlantic coast from southern Iberia to the North Sea, exploring ports that have long connected Western Europe to the wider world and that serve as repositories for some of its finest cultural and artistic achievements.

Sailing northward from Lisbon, we explore a carefully curated group of sites that represent essential elements of the European legacy, spanning centuries from the medieval castles and cathedrals of Portugal and Spain to the vineyards of Bordeaux and the beaches of Normandy. Among the places we visit are no fewer than six UNESCO World Heritage Sites—Lisbon's Jerónimos Monastery; the historic University of Coimbra; the great Christian pilgrimage site of Santiago de Compostela; the architectural masterpieces of Romanesque Oviedo and Neoclassical Bordeaux; and the virtual open-air museum that is Bruges. In addition to these justly famous landmarks and monuments, other highlights include a day visiting the wine-producing châteaux of the Médoc and, in Normandy, discovering the medieval town of Bayeux and the proud city of Caen, rebuilt after the near total destruction of World War II.

Accompanying us throughout the voyage will be special guest lecturer **Jared Diamond**, Pulitzer Prize-winning author of some of the most influential books of the late 20th and early 21st centuries. In a series of lectures and discussions, Jared will bring his experience and expertise to bear in providing insight into the significance of the history and culture we encounter.

Our vessel for this extraordinary journey, the Swan Hellenic *Diana*, is a state-of-the-art, new-generation expedition cruise ship, launched in early 2023. Accommodating only 192 guests in beautifully appointed staterooms and balcony suites, *Diana* features several lounges, a restaurant, outdoor café, spa, library and beauty salon, and is equipped with the latest safety and environmentally friendly technology.

Please take a moment to look over the enclosed brochure and then begin making plans to join Jared Diamond and fellow travelers next spring as we explore *Western Europe's Historic Coastal Cities*.


DISTINGUISHED GUEST LECTURER

JARED DIAMOND



Jared Diamond is a Pulitzer Prize-winning author of six best-selling books, translated into 38 languages, about human societies and human evolution: Guns, Germs, and Steel; Collapse; Why Is Sex Fun?; The Third Chimpanzee; The World Until Yesterday, and Upheaval. As a professor of geography at UCLA

(University of California at Los Angeles), he is known for his breadth of interests, which involves conducting research and teaching in three other fields: the biology of New Guinea birds, digestive physiology, and conservation biology. His prizes and honors include the U.S. National Medal of Science, the Pulitzer Prize for Non-fiction, the Tyler Prize for Environmental Science, and election to the U.S. National Academy of Sciences. He is a director of World Wildlife Fund/U.S. and of Conservation International. As a biological explorer, his most widely publicized finding was his rediscovery, at the top of New Guinea's remote Foja Mountains, of the long-lost Golden-fronted Bowerbird, previously known only from four specimens found in a Paris feather shop in 1895.















Built in Finland, and launched in April 2023, Swan Hellenic's *Diana* is a new generation expedition cruise ship. Although at 12,100 tons the ship is large enough to accommodate more than 350 passengers, *Diana* will accommodate a maximum of 192 guests in 96 spacious staterooms and balcony suites. The low guest density results in one of the most generous indoor and outdoor space-to-guest ratios among cruise ships.

Featuring the latest advances in technology and engineering, *Diana* is among the world's first environmentally responsible ships. Equipped with hybrid engines and a unique water filtration system, *Diana* leaves a minimal footprint. For cruising in Polar regions, the ship meets the stringent requirements of the new Polar Code with its high PC5 Category A ice strengthened hull and other advanced features. A computer-controlled Dynamic Positioning System allows the ship to maintain position without anchoring. Operated by a complement of 135 experienced European officers and international crew members, *Diana* will

carry a fleet of Zodiacs, versatile landing boats, and kayaks. Powerful stabilizers provide a smooth ride.

Diana's interior spaces exude sophisticated elegance, with most rooms opening to panoramic views of the sea. All staterooms and suites face outside and are equipped with private facilities, climate control, TV, Wi-Fi and USB connections and other amenities. Of the ship's 96 staterooms, 76 have balconies. Public areas include a spacious observation lounge equipped with state-of-the-art facilities for lectures and presentations; a club lounge; a restaurant that accommodates all guests at one seating; an outdoor café/bar that surrounds the heated swimming pool; a wellness area with gym, spa, and sauna with an adjoining outdoor jacuzzi; library; beauty salon; and an infirmary that is attended by a full-time doctor and nurse. The ship also features expansive open-deck areas. Two elevators connect all decks. Attentive service is provided on a 24-hour basis. The outstanding cuisine is complemented by fine wines at lunch and dinner.



Wednesday, May 13, 2026 **DEPART THE UNITED STATES**

Thursday, May 14

LISBON, Portugal

Arrive in Lisbon and transfer to the *Avenida Palace Hotel* (or similar), our home for the night. Join fellow travelers this evening for a welcome dinner. (D)

Friday, May 15

LISBON/EMBARKATION

Following breakfast at the hotel, set off on a panoramic tour of



Lisbon's highlights, including the Belém Quarter and the Jerónimos Monastery, a superb example of the Portuguese Manueline style of architecture and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Also see the Monument of Discoveries and historic Belém Tower, the point from which many Portuguese explorers, including Vasco da Gama, set sail. In the afternoon, transfer to the pier to embark *Diana* and set sail in early evening. (B,L,D)

Saturday, May 16

FIGUEIRA DA FOZ/COIMBRA/CONIMBRIGA

From Figueira da Foz, travel to Coimbra, famous for its university, the oldest in Portugal and one of the oldest in Europe, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We tour the campus and visit Coimbra's Old Town, which features a splendid Romanesque Cathedral. In nearby Conimbriga we explore the beautifully preserved Roman ruins, most of which date from the reign of Emperor Augustus, and which constitute the largest Roman site in Portugal. (B,L,D)

Sunday, May 17

FERROL, Spain/SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA

Travel today to Santiago de Compostela, one of the most beautiful and historic medieval cities in Spain, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the third most important Christian pilgrimage site in the world, after Jerusalem and Rome. A guided tour of this remarkable town includes the Cathedral, the Townhall, and the Palace of Saint Jerome. (B,L,D)

Monday, May 18 **GIJÓN/OVIEDO**

Arrive in Gijón. With a history stretching back to Roman antiquity, Gijón became an important industrial and maritime center in the 18th and 19th centuries. Today, Gijón is a vibrant modern city with a strong cultural identity reflected in its colorful architecture and old quarter layout. Later, enjoy an excursion to historic Oviedo. Established in the 8th century as the first Christian kingdom on the Iberian Peninsula after the reign of the Moors, Oviedo is considered a "cradle of the Reconquista." It became a political, religious, and cultural center under medieval kings like Alfonso II, who is credited with initiating the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage. Alfonso II commissioned numerous churches and palaces, many of which survive today in Oviedo as pre-Romanesque architectural masterpieces with designated UNESCO World Heritage status. (B,L,D)

Tuesday, May 19

SANTANDER/SANTILLANA DEL MAR

Santillana del Mar is one of the best-preserved medieval towns in Western Europe, in part due to strict rules governing development first introduced in the 16th century. Established in the 8th century as a way station on the northern pilgrimage route to Santiago de Compostela, it is built around the Church of Santa Juliana and contains some of the best examples of Romanesque architecture in Northwestern Spain. The historic quarter's cobblestone streets are lined with grand buildings, including the Renaissance Velarde Palace and the baroque Casa de Valdivielso. (B,L,D)



Wednesday, May 20 and Thursday, May 21 **BORDEAUX/THE MÉDOC, France**

Diana sails the Gironde Estuary of the Garonne River to Bordeaux, where it will stay in port for two days. Founded by the Celts around 300 BC, invaded by the Roman empire under Julius Caesar, sacked by Frankish Vandals and later controlled by the English crown, Bordeaux has nonetheless flourished as a center of trade and wine production for over two thousand years. At the end of the Hundred Years' War Bordeaux returned to French sovereignty and became a wealthy port in the 18th century due to lucrative trade routes with the West Indies and the Americas. The prosperity of this golden age is reflected in Bordeaux's elegant neoclassical architecture which, together with excellent urban planning, earned the city its UNESCO World Heritage Site categorization. La Cité du Vin is globally renowned as the capital of one of the world's most prestigious wine regions. We will explore Bordeaux and the fabled Médoc region to the north. Centuries of heritage as a seat of noble patronage and commerce are evident from the grand châteaux, charming villages, and picturesque stone manor houses that punctuate the rolling vineyards and pine forests of this serene rural landscape. Friday, May 22

AT SEA

During a day at sea, attend informative lectures and briefings from Jared Diamond and onboard experts, relax and enjoy cruising the open sea, and treat yourself to some of the many amenities aboard *Diana*. (B,L,D)

Saturday, May 23

CHERBOURG/BAYEUX & CAEN

Diana calls at Cherbourg on Normandy's northern coast. As one of the largest artificial harbors in the world, this deep-water port has been a strategic hub for commercial and maritime activity since its construction in the 18th and 19th centuries. Journey to Bayeux and Caen. Bayeux retains much of its medieval charm as one of the few cities in Normandy to avoid destruction during the D-Day landings. In contrast, over 75% of Caen was decimated by six weeks of heavy bombing in 1944. The German-occupied city was vital to road and river transport through the region and its capture would limit German

ability to reinforce and resupply their troops. During the Battle of Caen, the Benedictine monastery L'Abbaye aux Hommes became a refuge for thousands of civilians. The Abbey and the Château de Caen fortress (one of the largest medieval strongholds in Europe), both dating from the 11th century Norman dynasty, did withstand the bombing. Though it was ultimately a military success for the Allies, the protracted battle had a devastating impact on civilian lives. The post-WWII reconstruction of Caen is a testament to the resilience of the city and its people. (B,L,D)

Sunday, May 24

OSTEND/BRUGES, Belgium


Bruges is a perfectly preserved medieval town known for its charming canals, magnificent architecture, and exquisite art. A walking tour through narrow cobblestone streets takes us to the marketplace, Belfry Tower, Town Hall and the Chapel of the Holy Blood. Explore City Hall's main room, a masterpiece of Gothic design with late 19th-century murals and a polychrome vault. Also visit the Church of Our Lady, which houses Michelangelo's sculpture of Madonna with Child. (B,L,D)

Monday, May 25

AMSTERDAM, The Netherlands

Disembark and transfer to the airport for flights homeward.





All accommodations aboard *Diana* are spacious staterooms and balcony suites.
