Beginning in Kangerlussuaq, our expedition starts in the fjords of Greenland's western coast, home to countless colonies of seabirds, reindeer grazing on the shore, and walruses. Sailing north, we will get to observe the Evigheds Glacier and eventually cross the Arctic Circle to explore the volcanic island of Disko Island and the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Disko Bay, with its magnificent calving glaciers and seasonal populations of whales, including belugas. Returning south toward Sisimiut, the second largest town in Greenland, we will have the opportunity to see Greenlandic artisans at work. Aboard the ship's fleet of Zodiacs, we will have the chance to explore a wilderness that has remained largely unchanged since the time of Erik the Red. Throughout this world of ice floes and glaciers, we will encounter various species of whales and seals, and if we are fortunate, a polar bear or two.

I look forward to hosting you amongst a team of resident expedition leaders and naturalists who will lead excursions ashore and operate Zodiac cruises that will bring us into intimate contact with the incredible places we visit.

Our vessel for this cruise is the Swan Hellenic *Vega*, a state-of-the-art, new-generation expedition cruise ship built in Finland and launched in 2022. Accommodating only 152 guests in superb staterooms and balcony suites, *Vega* features elegant common areas and the most modern mechanical and environmentally conscious technology, far exceeding the standards set by international regulatory agencies.

Dr. Michael Shermer is the Founding Publisher of Skeptic magazine and the host of the podcast The Michael Shermer Show. For 30 years he taught college and university courses in critical thinking, and for 18 years he was a monthly columnist for Scientific American. He is the author

of New York Times bestsellers Why People Believe Weird Things and The Believing Brain, Why Darwin Matters, The Science of Good and Evil, The Moral Arc, Heavens on Earth, Giving the Devil His Due, and Conspiracy: Why the Rational Believe the Irrational. His new book is Truth: What it is, How to Find it, Why it Still Matters.

THE NEW 152-GUEST EXPEDITION CRUISE SHIP VEGA











Built in Finland and launched in July 2022, Swan Hellenic's *Vega* is a new-generation expedition cruise ship. Although at 10,250 tons the ship is large enough to accommodate more than 250 passengers, *Vega* will accommodate a maximum of 152 guests in 76 spacious staterooms and balcony suites. The low guest density results in one of the most generous indoor and outdoor space-to-guest ratios among cruise ships.

Featuring the latest advances in technology and engineering, *Vega* is among the world's first environmentally responsible ships. Equipped with hybrid engines and a unique water filtration system, *Vega* leaves a minimal footprint. For cruising in Polar regions, the ship meets the stringent requirements of the new Polar Code with its high PC5 Category A ice-strengthened hull and other advanced features. A computer-controlled Dynamic Positioning System allows the ship to maintain position without anchoring. Operated by a complement of 120 experienced European officers and international crew members, *Vega* will

carry a fleet of Zodiacs, versatile landing boats, and kayaks. Powerful stabilizers provide a smooth ride.

Vega's interior spaces exude sophisticated elegance, with most rooms opening to panoramic views of the sea. All staterooms and suites face outside and are equipped with private facilities, climate control, TV, Wi-Fi and USB connections, and other amenities. Of the ship's 76 staterooms, 60 have balconies. Public areas include a spacious observation lounge equipped with state-of-the-art facilities for lectures and presentations; a club lounge; a restaurant that accommodates all guests at one seating; an outdoor café/bar that surrounds the heated swimming pool; a wellness area with gym, spa, and sauna with an adjoining outdoor jacuzzi; library; beauty salon; and an infirmary that is attended by a full-time doctor and nurse. The ship also features expansive open-deck areas. Two elevators connect all decks. Attentive service is provided on a 24-hour basis. The outstanding cuisine is complemented by fine wines at lunch and dinner.







Tuesday, August 25, 2026 **DEPART THE US**

Wednesday, August 26

REYKJAVÍK, Iceland

Arrive at Keflavík International Airport, Reykjavík's airport. Upon arrival, transfer to the *Courtyard by Marriott Hotel* (or similar) in the town of Keflavík, which is located just 30 miles from Reykjavík. In the evening, meet fellow travelers, your host Dr. Michael Shermer, and the Trip Director at a welcome dinner. (D)

Thursday, August 27

REYKJAVÍK/KANGERLUSSUAQ/EMBARK

Fly to Kangerlussuaq, set at the head of a long Arctic fjord and Greenland's main gateway. Transfer to the port to embark on the *Vega* and sail. (B,L,D)

Friday, August 28

EVIGHEDS GLACIER

Today we will observe the Evigheds Glacier by Zodiac, weather permitting. The Glacier carves its way through the dramatic Kangerlussuatsiaq—Eternity Fjord. This 75-kilometer stretch of deep blue water and towering cliffs is alive with adventure. Watch white-tailed eagles and black-legged kittiwakes wheel overhead, and feel the crack of calving icebergs echo through the fjord. Here, in one of the Arctic's most awe-inspiring landscapes, experience the raw power of nature and witness firsthand how Greenland's ice is constantly reshaping its rugged frontier. (B,L,D)

Saturday, August 29

QEQERTARSUAQ, Disko Island

Disko Island is the only volcanic island in Greenland, with its rich soil, basalt columns, and hot springs contrasting sharply with the rest of the country. Qeqertarsuaq, a small town at the southern end of the island, affords opportunities for hiking on the black sand beaches and perhaps a visit to Arctic Station, a satellite campus of the University of Copenhagen. (B,L,D)

Sunday, August 30

UUMMANNAQ

Uummannaq, meaning "heart-shaped" in Greenlandic, takes its name from the striking twin-peaked granite mountain that dominates the island's northern half. According to local legend, a piece of your heart stays behind when you visit—forever calling you back. Nestled among glaciated peaks and shimmering fjords, this enchanting region is known as the sunniest place in Greenland and has offered shelter and inspiration to Inuit communities for over 4,500 years. (B,L,D)

Monday, August 31 and Tuesday, September 1 ILULISSAT/DISKO BAY

Heading further north, we come to Ilulissat and the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Disko Bay. Here we will spend two days exploring



this fascinating region. Eqi Glacier is one of the world's most active glaciers and offers our best chance to witness calving. This is also the point in our expedition where we are most likely to see beluga whales as they feed on the rich krill in front of the glaciers. Weather and ice permitting, we will call in the town of Ilulissat (the word means "iceberg"), where Knud Rasmussen grew up, and where we will gain a first-hand sense of why he was drawn to devote his life to the exploration of the Arctic. (B,L,D)

Wednesday, September 2 **SISIMIUT**

Today we sail some 50 miles north of the Arctic Circle to call in Sisimiut, the second largest town in Greenland, boasting a population of just about 6,000. Primarily a fishing village, Sisimiut offers a small museum and an arts and crafts center. We may have the opportunity to see artisans at work and perhaps to purchase some Greenlandic arts and crafts. (B,L,D)

Thursday, September 3

KANGERLUSSUAQ/REYKJAVÍK, Iceland

Disembark Vega for a flight from Kangerlussuaq to Keflavík. Upon arrival, transfer to the Courtyard by Marriott Hotel (or similar) for a farewell dinner and an overnight stay. (B,D)


Friday, September 4

REYKJAVÍK/US

After breakfast at the hotel, transfer to the airport for flights home. (B)

ACTIVITY LEVEL

Travelers can expect an estimated total of 2-3 hours of walking per day. Nature and town excursions may involve walking on inclined or uneven surfaces such as rocky or slippery trails, unpaved paths, cobblestones, or stairs without handrails. During some site visits guests may need to stand if seating is not available. Expedition excursions use motorized Zodiac boats, which can require taking a few big steps on a moving craft with crewmember assistance. Embarking and disembarking from motor coaches will also be necessary.
