Ancient aesthetics come alive in the exquisitely designed gardens of Suizenji Jojuen, the Prefectural Traditional Crafts Center in Kumamoto, and the continued production of Oshima Tsumugi silk. Modernist impulses are evident in thriving urban centers like Sapporo and Fukuoka, in Moerenuma Park featuring the work of sculptor Noguchi Isamu, and at the Space Center on Tanegashima Island.

As a nation of sprawling islands, Japan is best explored by sea, and we have the ideal vessel for the task. Aboard the *Mitsui Ocean Fuji*, guests enjoy an immersive cruise experience rooted in Japanese heritage and traditions, including omotenashi, the art of heartfelt and meticulous hospitality. Jared Diamond is a Pulitzer Prize-winning author of six best-selling books, translated into 38 languages, about human societies and human evolution: *Guns, Germs, and Steel*; *Collapse*; *Why Is Sex Fun?*; *The Third Chimpanzee*; *The World Until Yesterday*, and *Upheaval*. As a professor of geography at UCLA (University of California at Los Angeles), he is known for his breadth of interests, which involves conducting research and teaching in three other fields: the biology of New Guinea birds, digestive physiology, and conservation biology. His prizes and honors include the U.S. National Medal of Science, the Pulitzer Prize for Non-fiction, the Tyler Prize for Environmental Science, and election to the U.S. National Academy of Sciences. He is a director of World Wildlife Fund/U.S. and of Conservation International. As a biological explorer, his most widely publicized finding was his rediscovery, at the top of New Guinea's remote Foja Mountains, of the long-lost Golden-fronted Bowerbird, previously known only from four specimens found in a Paris feather shop in 1895.





DEPART THE US FOR TOKYO, Japan

Saturday, September 12

TOKYO, Japan

Arrive in Tokyo's Narita Airport and transfer to the *Hilton Tokyo Narita Airport* (or similar) for the night. Dinner will be available at the hotel this evening. (D)



Sunday, September 13

TOKYO/HAKODATE, Hokkaido

Transfer in the morning to Haneda Airport for the flight to Hakodate. Located on the south shore of Hokkaido, Japan's northernmost island, Hakodate was one of the country's first ports to open to international trade after Japan's era of isolation. Influence from the Western world is visibly evident throughout this picturesque city. Check in this afternoon at the *Hotel & Spa Resort La Vista* (or similar) for three nights. This evening, meet your fellow travelers officially for a welcome dinner. (B,D)

Monday, September 14

HAKODATE

Begin this morning with a city tour, starting at the atmospheric Asaichi Morning Market, with over 250 vendors selling fresh seafood and local produce. Continue to Hakodate-yama, an inactive volcano that provides spectacular views over the city and surrounding bay, followed by the steep streets of the architecturally intriguing Motomachi neighborhood. Later, visit Fort Goryokaku, Japan's first citadel built in Western star-shaped style at the end of the Edo period. Today's tour ends at the Hakodate Museum of Northern Peoples, with exhibits that relate to the Ainu culture and those of other Indigenous peoples. The afternoon is at leisure for independent activities. (B,L)

Tuesday, September 15

HAKODATE/ONUMA QUASI-NATIONAL PARK/HAKODATE

Today's excursion to the Onuma Quasi-National Park is ideal for nature lovers, with a trio of beautiful lakes to admire from the peak of dormant Mount Komagatake. The eruptions of this volcano shaped the surrounding landscape and created the fertile conditions that give the park its lush greenery. Onuma's expansive scenery is punctuated by smaller ponds and islands, some connected by a network of charming humpback bridges. (B,L)

Wednesday, September 16

HAKODATE/SAPPORO, Hokkaido

Depart Hakodate this morning via coach to Sapporo, the vibrant capital city of the Hokkaido Prefecture. Sapporo is the 5th largest city in Japan and lays claim to several "firsts". It was the first city in Asia to host the winter Olympics (in 1972), and is the birthplace of Japan's oldest beer brand, the eponymous Sapporo beer. It is also recognized as a city that pioneered the adoption of Western technologies in Japan, beginning in the latter half of the 19th century. Accommodations for the next three nights are at the *Sapporo Grand Hotel* (or similar), built in 1934 as the city's first hotel in European style. (B,L,D)

Thursday, September 17

SAPPORO

Explore Sapporo in the morning. First visit the beautiful Hokkaido University Botanical Gardens and its Museum with a collection of countless scientific specimens. Continue to Hokkaido-jingu, Sapporo's main Shinto shrine. This morning's tour ends with a visit

to the Sapporo Beer Museum and Garden, housed in a building dating from 1891. In the afternoon, drive to Sapporo's outskirts to visit the Moerenuma Park, which was designed by the internationally-renowned Japanese-American sculptor Isamu Noguchi and displays several of his works, along with other intriguing features. (B,L)

Friday, September 18

SAPPORO

This morning, enjoy an excursion to the Historic Village of Hokkaido. Located in the lovely Nopporo Forest Park, this open-air museum consists of sixty buildings, divided into four sections to present faithful representations of a large Hokkaido town, a fishing village, a farm village, and a mountain village during the Meiji and Taisho Periods. The park is also home to the impressive Hokkaido Museum, whose collections showcase the island's history from prehistoric times to the present. Spend the afternoon at leisure. (B,L,D)

Saturday, September 19

SAPPORO/OSAKA/KOBE – EMBARK THE MITSUI OCEAN FUJI

Fly this morning from Sapporo to Osaka. Upon arrival, transfer to Kobe to embark on the cruise ship *Mitsui Ocean Fuji* and settle in for your 8-night voyage. The ship sails in the evening. (B,D)

Sunday, September 20

HAKATA, Kyushu

Located on the northwest coast of Kyushu Island, Hakata is the former merchants' quarter of the dynamic city of Fukuoka. Our

tour of the area includes the Kushida-jinja shrine, which is Hakata's oldest and presents an intriguing contrast surrounded by the rest of Fukuoka's notably futuristic modern architecture. Visit also the Hakata Machiya Furusato-kan, an interesting folk museum spread between three machiya, or traditional Japanese townhouses. Later, drive south of the city to visit the small town of Dazaifu, which rose to prominence in the 7th century. Many of Dazaifu's historic sites have survived through the centuries, such as its magnificent 10th-century Tenmangu shrine. (B,L,D)

Monday, September 21

BUSAN, South Korea

The *Mitsui Ocean Fuji* arrives in Busan, South Korea. From this thriving port city, take an excursion to the Gyeongju Historic Area, ancient capital of the Silla Kingdom which enjoyed a golden age from the 7th to 10th centuries. Designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Gyeongju is a virtual open-air museum with distinctive burial mounds, pagodas, ancient temples, and palaces as well as outstanding examples of Korean Buddhist art from the flowering of Silla culture. (B,L,D)

Tuesday, September 22

YATSUSHIRO/KUMAMOTO, Kyushu

From the port town of Yatsushiro, drive to nearby Kumamoto, built in 1607 during Japan's feudal era. The town's center is dominated by the formidable Kumamoto-jo, an imposing fortress complex with foundations that date to 1467 and widely regarded as one of the best-fortified castles ever built in Japan. Later visit the Suizenji

Jojuen, a splendid traditional Japanese garden founded in 1632, and the excellent Prefectural Traditional Crafts Center which displays traditional crafts by local artisans, many of which are for sale. (B,L,D)

Wednesday, September 23

YAMAGAWA/IBUSUKI, Kyushu

Arrive in Yamagawa for an excursion to Ibusuki, a small town with an unparalleled setting between sweeping Kagoshima Bay and the perfect stratovolcanic cone of Mount Kaimondake. The thermal activity of the volcano has caused Ibusuki to become known for its 800+ hot springs, the delightful therapeutic benefits of which we can try. Today's excursion also includes Satsuma Denshokan, a gorgeous building designed in the Nara/Heian style that was constructed to house the art and history collection of its owner. (B,L,D)

Thursday, September 24

AMAMI OSHIMA ISLAND, Nansei Islands

Call this morning in the Amami Islands, a group of small islands scattered south of Kyushu. Our destination is Amami Oshima, notable for its lush forests, pristine white sand beaches, and the production of the unique Oshima Tsumugi silk, which is primarily used in making kimonos. Explore this seldom-visited island and enjoy its natural beauty. (B,L,D)

Friday, September 25

TANEGASHIMA ISLAND, Nansei Islands

Another of Japan's small subtropical southern islands, Tanegashima has a long history. Excavations have revealed that it was home to a well-developed culture that dates back to the 4th century AD. The island is also a designated Important Bird Area, and home to the Tanegashima Space Center, which is Japan's largest space development center. Today's activities feature a visit to the Space Center and exploration of the island. (B,L,D)

Saturday, September 26

AT SEA

Enjoy the ship's amenities, attend lectures, and participate in Japanese cultural events during the day at sea en route to Kobe. (B,L,D)

Sunday, September 27

KOBE, Kansai/DISEMBARK/OSAKA/HOMEWARD

After breakfast onboard, disembark in Kobe and transfer to the Osaka airport for flights homeward. (B)

POST - CRUISE EXTENSION TO KYOTO

An optional three-day post-cruise extension to Kyoto is available, featuring visits to the rock garden at Ryoan-ji, the glittering Golden Pavilion and gardens of Kinkaku-ji, the Arashiyama district, the "Pure Water Temple" of Kiyomizu-dera, and a traditional tea ceremony known as *chanoyu*.
