Our latest findings suggest that those who've speculated that educational institutions have become less effective may have a point. Check out our graphs below.


Graph 1 indicates that greater levels of educational achievement do not reduce endorsement of the noble savage myth for Millennials and GenZ, but did somewhat for older generations.

Graph 2 indicates greater trust in educators is associated with lower accuracy about this topic.
